- Refugees IRIS has resettled in the last 13 years have included families from: Afghanistan, Armenia, Burma, Cuba, Democratic Republic of the Congo, El Salvador, Eritrea, Guatemala, Honduras, Iran, Iraq, Moldova, Pakistan, Russia, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Syria, Uganda, Ukraine and Vietnam
- Since becoming a legal service provider in 2010, IRIS has assisted more than 3,300 low income and underserved families with their immigration needs including citizenship, adjustment of status, family reunification and DACA

- In 2019 IRIS' focus will be on strengthening its immigration legal and social service departments and decreasing its reliance on funding from government sources
- IRIS expects to assist an estimated 2,500 people in its programs in 2019


