### WHY DO WE VOTE

Voting is an integral part of the democratic process and is one of the most important actions we can take as citizens of the United States. Constituents have the responsibility and power to make their voice heard in the halls of every elected office. We often underestimate the power of our singular vote because they don't compare to the millions that go into an election. It takes a single voice to speak up for marginalized communities in our nation. And it takes every single ballot to decide who collectively leads and shapes the communities where we live. When you fill out a ballot from now on, remember the values and constituents that inspire you to be civically engaged. Let us use our collective power to achieve a more abundant and sustainable world. Let our votes reflect the radical diversity, inclusion, and pluralism that make Southern California our pride and joy. And let us honor the privilege in a democratic society and the sacred responsibility fought for by generations past to create a just, accountable, and compassionate society.

# STATEWIDE DETAILS

Election day is November 3rd this year. The state of California has deadlines for registration, voting (by mail or person), and more.

### Voter registration deadlines

- You can register to vote online at https://registertovote.ca.gov/ by 10/19/20.
- You can register to vote online by email, postmarked by 10/19/20.
- You can register to vote on Election Day, 11/3/2020, at your nearest polling place.

### Absentee ballot deadlines

- You can request an absentee ballot by 10/27/2020
- You can return the absentee ballot by mail postmarked by 11/3/2020
- You can return your absentee ballot on Election Day, 11/3/2020, at your nearest polling place.

### Early voting timeline

• Every registered voter will receive a mail-in ballot at their residence and can vote early from 10/5-11/2/2020, but dates and hours for early voting at polling places may vary based on the county that you live.

- You can also register and vote on Election Day at any polling place.
- Conditional Voter Registration is a safety net for Californians who miss the deadline to register to vote or update their voter registration information. Voters can use the Conditional Voter Registration process from the day after the deadline through Election Day. Eligible citizens can go to their county election office, polling place, or vote center to register and vote conditionally. The ballots will be processed once the county elections office has completed the voter registration verification process.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

This section serves as your go-to place for any questions that you might have during our entire voting process through November.

- How do we vote this year?
  - According to the office of the California Secretary of State, you will be able to vote in every single way that you've been able to before, but with slight changes:
    - Every registered voter will receive a mail-in ballot,
    - Every registered voter can track the status of their ballot from receipt to submission by telephone, text, or email, and
    - Every registered voter as the option of voting earlier and in person a number of polling places with additional precautions taken for health and safety, including social distancing and cleaning procedures in place.
- Where can I submit my ballot?
  - You can submit your ballet:
    - In the mail,
    - By dropping it into a secure voting box, and
    - At a polling place.
- How can I keep track of the latest updates to the election process and find out more information about my vote in particular?

- When can I vote?
  - You can begin voting as soon as you get your mail-in vote. Ballots sent by mail must be postmarked by November 3, 2020; ballots returned at a secure ballot drop box must be deposited by 8:00 p.m. on November 3, 2020.
  - If you choose to vote in person, polling places will begin opening depending on the rules for your county. You can find county website for the election on the Resources page. Find your nearest polling place here:
