Join us for the 129th Annual Meeting of Convention of the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Los Angeles: *Inside Out Church: Episcopal Identity in our Neighborhoods* on Friday and Saturday, November 8 and 9, 2024.

Celebrating the 50th anniversary of the ordination of women to the priesthood in the Episcopal Church, it is with great joy we welcome the Rev. Dr. Carter Heyward, one of the historic Philadelphia Eleven, as special guest and keynote speaker of this year's Diocesan Convention.

Attendance: Diocesan Convention 2024 will be an in-person event on Friday and Saturday, November 8 and 9, at the Riverside Convention Center at 3637 5th Street, Riverside 92501.

Friday night is not limited to delegates – <u>all</u> are invited and encouraged to attend!

The film is 90 minutes and will begin at 7:30 p.m. with complimentary snacks. There is no charge for the film screening.

The business session will be called to order on Saturday morning with Holy Eucharist. Convention will adjourn by 4:00 p.m. that afternoon. The business session, including Eucharist, will be livestreamed on the diocesan Facebook page and YouTube channel.

Voting: Voting will be done electronically. Delegates will be assigned a voting device at Registration.

Delegates and visitors are also welcome to dine off-campus during the lunch break. No outside food is permitted in the Convention Center.

Childcare: We will have childcare providers onsite to care for children during Convention (8 a.m. -4 p.m. on Saturday) in a breakout room adjacent to the main Meeting Hall. Clergy Spouses: As in previous years, a separate room will be set aside for clergy spouses attending the convention, hosted by Canon Kathy O'Connor, wife of Bishop Taylor. For planning purposes, Canon O'Connor requests that spouses let her know if they will be attending the convention. Youth participation: The Convention office is excited to welcome Missy Morain, Missioner for Christian Formation, Children, and Youth to the diocesan staff. Missy will be coordinating the youth presence at Convention. There are two ways for youth and young adults to participate: as a delegate or volunteer.

Each deanery is entitled to one youth delegate, age 14-22, to serve as a representative for the deanery with full seat, voice, and vote, the same way an adult lay delegate would represent a congregation.

Youth volunteers will be asked to assist with Registration, the Exhibit Hall, and serve as ushers, runners, and facilitators where needed. There is no cost to participate – meals, snacks, and drinks will be provided – and the Convention office can provide letters certifying volunteer hours.

We will be hosting a training session for the youth delegates and youth volunteers on Zoom, Monday 11/4 at 7:30pm, so they know what to expect at Convention, and Canon Andy Tomat will also be joining to answer any questions about the budget.
